THE MCMASTER WISE INITIATIVE

The WISE Initiative was formed after a survey of female graduate students conducted during the summer of 2006 revealed a strong need for a forum at McMaster University in which female graduate students can identify, discuss, and learn about gender-related issues specific to their field of work and study.

Mission:

The McMaster Women in Science and Engineering (WISE) Initiative is an integrated network of academics and professionals in science and engineering, whose mission it is to support, celebrate and advocate women in science and engineering at McMaster University.

Objective & Strategy:

Our main objectives are to create a supportive network of female mentors, increase issuespecific education for students, and facilitate interdisciplinary collaboration and communication. The WISE Initiative uses a multifaceted approach, through:

Support:

- Networking: Social events and mentor list
- Fostering academics: Professional development workshops and our annual multidisciplinary research conference (CREST)
- Showcasing research by female students in science or engineering

Celebration:

- Movie nights showcasing women in science
- Invited speakers (female industry leaders and academics)

Advocacy:

- Instigating and facilitating discussion with senior administrations regarding women in science and engineering
- Communicating with other WISE groups across Canada

WISE Current Research in Engineering, Science, and Technology (CREST) Annual Meeting (April 5-6, 2013)

Our 7th annual research conference, formerly the WISE International Women's Day Conference, was held on Friday April 5th and Saturday April 6th 2012. The conference program included an exceptional keynote speaker, two workshops, two career panels, as well as oral presentations. Approximately forty presenters, both female and male, participated in the conference, including students from neighbouring universities. Approximately 100 people attended the conference.

Keynote Speakers

We were very excited to host Dr. Marilyn L. Fogel as our keynote speaker this year.

Dr. Fogel is internationally recognized as a pioneer in the use of stable isotopes for understanding fundamental processes in ecology, paleoclimatology, biogeochemistry and astrobiology. Her work includes investigating how life originated on Earth as well as assessing signatures of life which can be used to determine if and how life might have originated and functioned on other solar system bodies such as Mars. Dr. Fogel has published over 150 papers in refereed journals and books. She was a senior staff scientist at the Carnegie Institution of Washington's Geophysical Laboratory from 1979 until 2012. Dr. Fogel is a member of National Research Council's Space Studies Board, a founding member of the Committee studying the Origin and Evolution of Life, and a Co-Investigator on Jet Propulsion Laboratory's and Carnegie Institution of Washington's NASA Astrobiology teams.

Research Presentations

The conference featured oral presentation sessions by approximately forty students from different faculties. The talks were judged by post-doctoral and faculty volunteers based on clarity of presentation and ability to communicate to a general science audience. Two winners were recognized with prizes made possible through our funding.

Workshops and Career Panels

This year we had two workshops and two career panels at the CREST conference. The first workshop was on the topic of anxiety and depression in graduate school. Led by psychologist Dr. Nathan J. Cooper, this workshop aimed to teach participants about using cognitive behavioural therapy as a framework for understanding the interaction between situations, thoughts, feelings, and behaviours. The second workshop was on the topic of using social media to build a women's network. Presented McMaster alumni career coach Dr. Catherine Maybrey, this workshop discussed the benefits of LinkedIn and Twitter and provided practical tips for maximizing and managing one's online presence. Additionally, we presented two very popular career panels discussing career opportunities within academia as well as "outside the Ivory Tower". Our seven female panelists shared their personal experiences and offered invaluable advice for charting a unique career path.

FINANCIAL REPORT (2012-2013)

The WISE committee approached various internal and external sources to raise the necessary funds to cover our budget. This year WISE will be teaming up with Let's Talk Science in a community outreach project to engage young girls in science and engineering and access the factors that influence girls choosing to pursue science and engineering studies. This endeavour will consist of hosting a free of charge science and engineering camp on campus for girls in grades 6 and 9, utilizing questionnaires before and after the activities to measure any changes in the attitude toward science and engineering as a result of the small group female only learning environment.
